Councillor Schofield received an email from a resident saying that they had
photographed and reported a fly-tipper to Newport Council. The response was that

well" as the person has a reputation for violence. Councillors are concerned at this
reaction as it contradicts official advice to report fly-tippers, and residents should not
be put in this confrontational position.

- Councillors formally adopted the new Model Standing Orders 2018 (Wales). There is no longer a legal requirement for community councils to appoint a Data Protection Officer, but Councillor Davies will continue in that role.
- It has been reported that Newport Wastesavers are charging schools to collect recycling. Councillors believe that this sends a completely wrong message, as cash-strapped schools may decide to save money by putting recyclable waste into general rubbish bins. Councillor Hallett will raise the matter with Wastesavers when he meets them under the Plastic Reduction initiative.
